Why This Book Was Written

- *“Gospels” are “Good News about a King/Kingdom”*
- *“Synoptic” Gospels “see together.”*

Why This Book Was Written - Matthew

- *Author: Matthew (Levi, tax collector, disciple of Jesus)*
- *Date: AD 50s or 60s*
- *Destination: Jewish audience in unknown location*
- *Purpose: To demonstrate Jesus is the Messiah predicted in the OT*

How This Book is Shaped - Matthew

- ***Introduction (1:1-4:17)*** | Genealogy, Birth, Preparation for Ministry (Baptism & Wilderness Temptation)
- ***Jesus's Ministry in Galilee (4:17-16:20)*** | Calling Disciples, Healing & Preaching Ministry, Discourses: Sermon on the Mount, Instruction to the Twelve, Parables of the Kingdom
- ***Jesus's Ministry in Jerusalem (16:21-25:46)*** | Predictions of Death and Resurrection, Teachings on the Church, Triumphal Entry, Parables of the Kingdom, Denouncement of the Pharisees, Discourses: Olivette Discourse, Parables
- ***Jesus's Passion & Resurrection (26:1-28:20)*** | Passion, Resurrection, Guards Report, Great Commission

Why This Book Was Written - Mark

- *Author: John Mark, “interpreter” of Peter*
- *Date: AD 50s or 60s*
- *Destination: Gentile audience (probably in Rome)*
- *Purpose: To teach that true discipleship is the way of the Cross*

How This Book is Shaped - Mark

- ***Jesus, the Son of God, as the Powerful Messiah (1:1-8:26) |***
“*Euthus*” (“Immediately”) 42x, Preparation for Ministry in the Wilderness, Ministry in Galilee: Healings, Exorcisms, and Parables.
- ***Jesus, the Son of God, as the Suffering Servant (8:27-16:8) |***
Jesus’s ministry on the way to Jerusalem, Jesus’s ministry at the Temple, Jesus’s death on the Cross and Empty tomb.
